The COVID-19 pandemic has not only altered the way millions of people work, but also has the potential to reshape the traditional concept of the workplace. Indeed, more than half of knowledge workers report that this remote work experience has taught them they can do a lot of their job from home and, as a result, they are now interested in working from home on a more frequent basis. What's driving greater appreciation for the home office? Distractions, limited space, and technical glitches aside, more than a third of workers believe their personal productivity has actually increased by working from home during the COVID-19 outbreak.
